The men who give B-25s their final grooming before test flight this week won the Mitch award for staving on the job.



Former NAA Amploye Helps AAF Install Aerial Camera In Mustang

Pfc. Darrell Bennett, a former employe of Dept. 31, was a member of the Ninth Army Air Force Service Squadron which first installed an aircraft camera in the tail of the famous P-51 Mustang, a news release from the Ninth Air Force has re-

The camera installation was accomplished one week after the commanding general of the Ninth Air Force fighter command gave Private Bennett's squadron permission to attempt the installation.

"Soon many more Mustangs were camera-equipped," the release stated, "and planes of the only tactical fighter reconnaisance group in any theater were streaking over enemy territory, blasting at Nazi targets with their .50 - cal. machine guns, 'shooting' sites and installations with their newly installed cameras to give intelligence officers vital pictorial information.

"With the new large camera, pilots go out over enemy territory at the Mustang's best flying level-where enemy planes can't match their speed and the chances of bringing back important photos, the planes and themselves, have been tremendously improved."

locker and laundry facilities,
front and rear entrances and
stairways for each unit.

Rental rates are \$62 a month for 2-bedroom units and \$58 a month for the 1-bedroom units. This rate includes utilities except electric lights, electric cooking and refrigeration. Each unit is provided with a 7-foot electric refrigerator which has a monthly rate of \$3.00 and a 3-burner and oven electric range with a rate of \$2.50 a month.

Parking Space Reasonable

Parking bays along the streets accommodate 134 cars without charge. Private car parking spaces, limited to 154, are provided off the streets for \$1.50 each monthly.

The eligibility of all tenants for the Fairfax Hills apartments must be approved by the War Housing Center in Kansas City, Kan. Applicants must be workers in essential industry and must meet one or more of the following requirements:

of the following requirements:

1. Workers who have come to Kansas City since Apr. 1, 1942.

2. Workers whose travel to and from employment requires excessive time or expense.

3. Workers now improperly housed.
