North American employes will assemble at 5:30 o'clock this afternoon to receive the Army-Navy "E" award for excellence in production from representatives of the United States War and Navy Departments.

The ceremony will be held in the pre-flight area outside the north doors of the high bay. In case of rain it will be in the recreation area at the north end of the high bay.

Pauline Schoop, a crane operator in Dept. 23, nights, and Lovel Masters, Dept. 40, nights, will represent North American employes in the ceremony.

Miss Schoop, whose three brothers have been in military service overseas, and Masters, who has worked here two and a half years, will receive token "E" pins from Comm. C. E. ## 30,000th NAA Plane to Army

The president of North American Aviation will announce NAA's 30,000th airplane today.

Record Revealed by J. H. Kindelberger as "E" Day Surprise

The 30,000th North American airplane since Hitler invaded Poland Sept., 1939, a B-25 equipped with an 8-gun nose, will be turned over to the Army Air Forces this afternoon in a surprise climax to the Army-Navy "E" award ceremony.

J. H. "Dutch" Kindelberger, president of North, American Aviation, will make the presentation of the plane to Brig. Gen. Ray G. Harris, supervisor of the Midwestern Procurement District, AAF Air Technical Service Command, who is here as the Army representative to present the "E" award formally to management and employes.

Besides the 30,000 airplanes, North American also has provided an equivalent of 6,535 in spare parts for a grand total of 36,535 airplanes.
